



How did they meet? What was her early career like in London? What was his like in Boston?

Vivian Zito and Larry LaFerla met through their shared involvement in the Boston underground music scene, particularly centered around the band 007 (later Dub7), active mainly in the early 1980s. Their connection was fostered by LaFerla's role as lead vocalist and central figure in the band, and Zito's deep archival research and documentation of that music environment.^{[1] [2]}

Vivian Zito's Early Career in London

Vivian Zito began her career in London as an archivist and historian specializing in music and cultural history. She earned a Master of Archives and Records Management from University College London. Her work focused on collecting, digitizing, and contextualizing ephemeral underground music artifacts such as flyers, tapes, and posters, building detailed archival narratives of distinct music scenes with rigorous use of primary sources and oral histories. Her approach emphasized cultural authenticity and archival ethics, especially concerning marginalized and underground communities.^{[3] [4]}

Lawrence LaFerla's Early Career in Boston

Larry LaFerla's early career unfolded in Boston within the vibrant post-punk and underground music scene of the late 1970s and early 1980s. He formed the band 007 (later Dub7) with a core group of musicians during high school years, blending ska, punk, and dub influences. LaFerla was a creative and performing force as lead vocalist, involved in songwriting and live performances across Boston's underground venues. After his active performance years, he transitioned into archival work chronicling the history of this scene as well as pursuing social psychology studies and later establishing a translation career in Japan.^{[5] [2] [6]}

In sum, their meeting arose organically from shared social and musical circuits, with Zito's archival work later complementing LaFerla's personal legacy from the Boston music scene. Both began early careers marked by passionate engagement with underground music culture—Zito through archival stewardship in London, and LaFerla through active musicianship in Boston.^{[2] [1] [3]}
